

# 2000 MIAC WOMEN'S GOLF PREVIEW

The 2000 MIAC Women's Golf season will be getting underway soon. Watch for Concordia College, 1999 MIAC Champion, to continue their dominence of the conference tourament. Concordia has won eight of the nine team championshipssince the beginning of the MIAC Women's Golf Championship in 1991, including five straight since the 1995 season. Keep an eye on Gustavus to challenge for the top stop in the conference as they a veteran squad this fall.

The 2000 MIAC Women's Golf Championship is set for Oct. 8 and 9 at Mankato Golf Club hosted by Gustavus.

## <u>Augsburg College</u>

A new season brings a new coach to Augsburg's women's golf program for 2000. Sheryl Maize, an LPGA teaching and club professional at Baker National Golf Course in Medina, MN, was hired in

August as interim head coach, replacing David Staniger, who resigned after two years as Augsburg's head coach to take a men's basketball head coaching position at the College of St. Scholastica. Maize brings plenty of experience to the position, having served as a key assistant coach at the University of Minnesota for two seasons. She was also a scholarship golfer at the University of Miami (FL), has played professional golf, and served as a teaching pro for the past five years.

Just two players -- Janell Johnson (So., St. Paul, MN) and Angie Gliniany (Jr., Brooklyn Park, MN) return from last spring's squad. Augsburg did not field a team in the fall half of last season, and only competed in one meet in the spring half. Two newcomers join the Auggie team for the fall half of the season. Nicole Thurmes (Fr., Farmington, MN) was a two-time all-conference selection in high school. Jackie Jacobs (Fr., Canton, S.D.) also joins the team after playing four years of high school golf.

## <u>Carleton College</u>

Season Preview:

Coach Betsy Larey is excited about having a full squad in the third year of women's golf at Carleton. The team is young—five of her seven players are firstyear students. First-years Emily Skinner (Wichita, Kan.) and Stella Schulte (Portland, Ore.) were key players on their high school teams and each competed at the State meet. Adding to the depth of the squad will be sophomore Katie Berg and first-year Catherine Larson (Maplewood, Minn.). The Knights are anticipating a much-improved level of play this season as several fine athletes will battle for the top five spots.

Season Preview:

Since the inception of MIAC women's golf in 1991 Concordia has won eight of the nine team championships, including five straight since the 1995 season. To continue this dominance in 2000 the Cobbers will need strong

performances from Jenni Kovash (Sr. Moorhead MN, Moorhead) who was a third team All-American selection in 2000 and Maria Amlen (Sr. Stockholm, Sweden) who placed ninth in last springs NCAA national meet. Missing from last years NCAA runner-up team will be All-Americans Kari Weidner (Fargo) and Christie Strecker (Albert Lea) who graduated in the spring. Coach Duane Siverson is looking to add solid golfers in the

final three spots on the team to continue the Cobbers tradition of excellence. The strength of the team should come from a strong incoming class of first year students.



Dating back to 1991 the Cobbers have won the MIAC eight times and been NCAA National Runners-up twice. During that time frame the Cobbers have had over 30 All-MIAC performers, and have placed 12 golfers on All-American teams.

from Waconia, Minn. and Kate Reiman, a junior from Cannon Falls, Minn. Other key returners with several years of varsity experience include senior Molly Grisham, and juniors Amy Ellingson, Janelle Evenson and Heidi Miller. Coach Boschee is also pleased to add sophomore transfer Alyssa Klein who is expected to contribute. The highlights of the team's fall schedule includes the MIAC Championships which they will host at Mankato Golf Club on Oct. 8-9 and the Lenoir Rhyne Invitational in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina on October 16-17.

Saint Mary's University women's coach Dan Messmann isn't quite sure what kind of numbers his women's team will put up this season.

But the first-year head coach is certain of one thing, he will have a team when the Cardinals open the season Sept. 10 at the Carleton Invitational.

"Just knowing that we will have enough players to field a team is a big step," admitted Messmann, who is taking over a program that has struggled with numbers in the past, but did manage to field a complete team in three of its four meets a year ago, including a seventh-place showing at the MIAC Championships. "Now I'd like to see us take the next step, to not just show up at these meets, but to be competitive as well."

And with three of their top four golfers returning, Kristin Klimmek (Jordan, Minn.), who led the team with a 99.8 scoring average, Robin LaVoie (East Grand Forks, Minn.) and Caitie Wondergem (Sheboygan, Wis.), that's not an unrealistic goal.





"We aren't going to get too hung up on where we finish in any certain meet, but I think our expectations are to go out and play up to our abilities," said Messmann. "If we play the way we are capable of playing, there's no question we're going to be competitive."

Sophomore Kris Paulson, the 1999 MIAC medalist, leads a deep St. Thomas women's golf team into the 2000-2001 seasons. Fourth-year coach Cathy Lombritto thinks her team has the depth to improve on last season's fourth-place conference finish. St. Thomas had the low team round on the last day of the 1999 MIAC Championship and missed third place by one stroke. The Tommies came back with a solid spring season and finished 1999-2000 ranked eighth nationally in Division III by GolfStat. UST has seven experienced players and six freshmen battling for lineup spots.

A year ago the Oles finished fifth in the MIAC and were sixth out of 16 teams at the Eau Claire Invitational, where the team set a school record team score of 336. The Oles have experience and numbers. "Sonja, Jenny, LivAnda and Emily will all have a strong showing in the MIAC and we have 10 other returners who will contribute to the success of the team.
