2000-01 MIAC Women's Hockey Athletes of the Week

February 27, 2001

Saint Mary's University sophomore goalkeeper **Missie Meemken** (St. Cloud, Minn.) stopped 60 of 61 shots in the Cardinals' MIAC semifinal round playoff sweep of No. 3-seed St. Thomas, including all 26 in SMU's series-clinching 2-0 victory Saturday night. No. 2-seed St. Mary's plays at No. 1-seed Gustavus in the playoff finals Friday and Saturday night. In four wins over St. Thomas this season (3-0, 3-2, 4-1 and 2-0), Meemken stopped 108 of 111 shots.

February 20, 2001

University of St. Thomas first-year wing **Jessica Christopherson** (Coon Rapids, Minn.) scored a six-point weekend with a pair of hat tricks in the Toms' 6-2 and 8-2 sweep of Bethel. In the second game, the score was tied 2-2 after one period when Christopherson scored three unanswered goals in a 12-minute span for a 5-2 Tommie lead. The wins let the Tommies take third place in the conference and earn the third seed for this week's playoffs. Christopherson led the conference in goals with 23 in 18 games and now has 27 goals and 13 assists in 25 games.

February 13, 2001

Concordia College sophomore goalkeeper **Shyla Wilson** (Cohasset, Minn./Grand Rapids, HS) stopped 76 of the 79 shots she faced in Concordia's weekend split with league-leading St. Mary's. On Friday night she stopped 38 shots and kept the Cobbers close until midway through the third period. On Saturday she recorded her first shutout of the season by stopping all 38 shots she faced. It was only the third time St. Mary's has been shut out this season, and the win broke the Cardinals nine game win streak. The victory marks the second straight weekend Concordia has beaten a nationally ranked team. Last weekend the Cobbers swept UW-Superior, who was ranked seventh at the time.

February 6, 2001 - Co-Players of the Week

Concordia College sophomore forward **Katie Jacques** (Tempe AZ) scored six of the seven goals for Concordia in the Cobbers two-game sweep of seventh ranked UW-Superior. On Friday night Jacques scored the first goal and the last goal in Concordia's 3-1 victory. On Saturday she scored all four goals in a 4-1 win. Coming into the series the Yellowjackets were 13-1 and ranked seventh in the latest USCHO poll. With the two wins Concordia improves to 11-7-0 on the year. The 11 wins sets a school record for most wins in a season. For the season Jacques has 26 goals, and is third in the MIAC in goals scored.

Gustavus Adolphus College junior forward **Sarah Moe** (St. Peter, Minn.) scored eight goals and picked up two assists as the Gusties swept Bethel last weekend by the scores of 12-1 and 11-0. In Friday's 12-1 win in St. Peter, Moe scored two goals and added two assists. In Saturday's 11-0 win at Bethel, Moe set a school record by scoring six goals, including four in the third period. Moe, who joined the team in January, leads the team in points with 16 including 10 goals and six assists. The Gusties are currently 13-4-0 overall and 10-2-0 in the MIAC.

January 30, 2001

Augsburg College senior forward **Angie Rieger** (Courtland, Minn./New Ulm Public HS) had a six-point weekend (four goals, two assists) as Augsburg swept two games on its annual East Coast trip. In Thursday's 5-2 win at Wesleyan (Conn.), Rieger scored the eventual game-winning goal on an unassisted tally, adding a goal and assist in the third period to seal the victory. On Saturday, in Augsburg's 5-0 shutout victory at Trinity (Conn.), Rieger scored the Auggies' first goal of the game on a power play and added another goal and assist. Rieger leads the Auggies in scoring, with 12 goals and 10 assists for 22 points. She also is expanding her school career records for scoring (59 goals, 46 assists, 105 points). After a 2-6 start to the season, the Auggies have won six of their last eight games to stand at 8-8 overall.

January 23, 2001

Saint Mary's University sophomore goalkeeper **Missie Meemken** (St. Cloud, Minn.) stopped 48 of 50 shots as the Saint Mary's University women's hockey team swept its MIAC series with St. Thomas last weekend. The Tommies, who entered the weekend averaging more than 4 goals a game en route to a conference-leading 8-1-1 record, could not get a shot past Meemken Friday as SMU rolled to a 3-0 victory. Meemken posted a 23-save performance the following night as the Cardinals completed the sweep -- and grabbed hold of first place in the MIAC standings - with a 3-2 win.

January 16, 2001

Augsburg College goalkeeper **Katie Fedoryk** (First-year, Austin, Minn.) faced a barrage of Gustavus shots in a two-game series over the weekend. In Friday's 4-1 loss, Fedoryk faced 47 Gustie shots and stopped 43, as Augsburg was outshot 47-14. On Saturday, Augsburg was outshot 55-26, and the puck was in the Auggie end most of the game. But Fedoryk came up big for the second game in a row, making 53 saves in a 2-1, overtime loss. Fedoryk played back-to-back in goal for the first time in her collegiate career.

January 9, 2001

University of St. Thomas freshman center **Tomery Stolz** (St. Louis Park, Minn.) scored six goals, including the game-winner with :03 remaining Saturday, in the Tommies' 5-4, 5-2 weekend sweep of St. Catherine. In Saturday's road win, Stolz knocked home a rebound shot with :03 to go to snap a 4-4 tie. In Sunday's home win, Stolz added four goals (including an empty-netter), breaking ties of 1-1 and 2-2 with second-period scores. The sweep let the 9-2 Toms move into sole possession of the conference lead at 7-1. The Toms, in their third season of varsity hockey, placed sixth in the MIAC in 1999-2000 at 4-9-1.

December 12, 2000

University of St. Thomas forward **Jessica Christopherson** (FR, Coon Rapids, Minn.) had six goals in the Tommies' MIAC series split with Concordia-Moorhead. Christopherson set a school record with four goals in Saturday's 9-6 loss, then scored two goals, including the game winner midway through the final period, in Sunday's 3-2 win. Christopherson has 12 goals and seven assists for 19 points in nine games. The Toms share the MIAC lead at 5-1 and are 7-2 overall.

December 5, 2000

Augsburg College junior **Kristi Brusletto** (Defense, Basalt, Colo.) scored two goals on Friday night and had an assist in Saturday afternoon's game, as the Auggies swept St. Benedict to pick up their first MIAC wins of the season. Brusletto scored both her goals on the power play in Friday's 4-1 victory, the eventual game-winning goal midway through the first period and the capper late in the game. She had the first assist on April Leger's game-tying goal midway through the first period of Saturday's game. Her two goals on Friday have enabled her to already equal her goal-scoring totals in each of her first two seasons.

November 29, 2000

St. Mary's University goalkeeper **Missie Meemken** (Junior, St. Cloud, Minn.) stopped 83 of 89 shots as the Cardinals posted a split with east-coast power Colgate last weekend. Meemken recorded 49 saves in a 3-2 loss to the Red Raiders on Saturday, then came back with a 34-save effort in SMU's 6-3 triumph on Sunday. For the season, Meemken has appeared in five games, posting a .941 save percentage and a 2.00 goals-against-average.

November 21, 2000

College of St. Catherine goalkeeper **Jaquelle Sevigny** (First-Year, Moorhead, Minn.) started her collegiate career with three shutouts in the Wildcats' 3-0 week. Sevigny stopped all 73 shots she faced in a 9-0 victory over UW-Eau Claire (14 saves) and stopped 59 shots in a pair of 3-0 wins over 1999-2000 MIAC co-champion Augsburg. Friday's 3-0 win was Augsburg's first home shutout loss to a Division III foe.

November 14, 2000

Bethel College forward **Emily Louwsma** (Junior, Eden Prairie, MN/Eden Prairie HS) collected 3 goals and 2 assists over the weekend as Bethel swept Hamline to go 2-0 on the season. In Thursday's 6-1 win, Louwsma had 2 goals and 1 assist and in Saturday's 6-3 victory, she tallied 1 goal and 1 assist.

November 7, 2000

College of Saint Benedict Junior **Katy Rollwagen** (Forward, Mendota Heights,MN/Visitation HS) scored 4 goals and added 5 assists in a two game sweep vs. Concordia-Moorhead. On Friday night, Rollwagen had 2 goals and 2 assists, including a short-handed goal in an 8-1 win. On Saturday, she had 2 goals and 3 assists in a huge 7-5 win, including an assist on the game winner and the insurance goal.
