

2003-04 MIAC Women's Hockey Athlete of the Week

March 8, 2004

Gustavus Adolphus College first year goaltender **Kristin Setterstrom** (Minnetonka, Minn./Eden Prairie HS) turned in two of her finest performances of the season to help Gustavus defeat St. Olaf 7-0 and St. Thomas 3-2 and win the MIAC Playoff Championship. Setterstrom recorded 28 saves and allowed two goals in the two games. Against St. Olaf, Setterstrom was only called upon to make seven saves, however she came up with the play of the game when she stopped a St. Olaf breakaway with Gustavus leading 1-0 in the second period. Against St. Thomas, Setterstrom came up with 21 saves including two breakaways by the Tommies. With the two wins, Setterstrom improves her season record to 12-2-0 and her goals against average to 1.28. She has posted seven straight wins and 10 in her last 11 games. The Gusties (22-5-0) will now host the UW-Stevens Point in a first round NCAA Tournament game on Saturday, March 13 at 7:00 pm with the winner advancing to the Division III Frozen Four on March 19-20 at a site to be determined.

March 1, 2004

Augsburg College senior goaltender **Katie Fedoryk** (Austin, Minn.), playing in her final game at Augsburg Ice Arena on Saturday, Fedoryk stopped 33 of the 34 shots she faced as Augsburg scored a 2-1 victory over MIAC regular-season champion St. Thomas, breaking a 20-game unbeaten streak for St. Thomas against MIAC competition. Fedoryk is having the best season of her career in her final year with the Auggies, with a 6-4-1 record, .929 save percentage and 1.80 goals-against-average with four shutouts. In her career, she has a .909 save percentage and 2.79 goals-against-average in 64 games (27-30-3) with a school-record eight shutouts. Augsburg qualified for the MIAC postseason playoffs for the second season in a row.

February 23, 2004

St. Olaf College senior defender **Sarah Ray** (St. Paul, Minn.) scored two goals and contributed two assists to help the Oles split their weekend series with Saint Mary's and remain in third place in the MIAC. Ray scored one goal and added two assists in Friday's 5-4 loss at home and then added one goal and one assist in the 3-1 win in Winona on Saturday. On the season, Ray has 10 goals and seven assists for 18 points in 22 games. She has 50 goals with 37 assists and 87 points in her St. Olaf career. The Oles are currently 10-6-0 in the MIAC and 12-9-2 overall. They are alone in third place in the MIAC and have clinched a MIAC playoff berth for the first time in school history, having played for just four seasons.

February 16, 2004

University of St. Thomas senior forward **Tomery Stolz** (St. Louis Park, Minn.) had a seven-point weekend to lead the first-place Tommies to a sweep of Saint Benedict, 6-2 and 6-1. In the process, Stolz moved into sixth place on the MIAC career scoring list with 141 points through 99 games. She had two goals and two assists in Sunday's road win and had a goal and two assists in Friday's home victory. The Tommies are 16-4-1 and have won 17 consecutive games vs. conference foes.

February 9, 2004

Gustavus Adolphus College sophomore defender **Abby Randall** (Minnetonka, Minn.) scored one goal and contributed two assists to help the Gusties sweep third place Saint Mary's over the weekend. Randall scored a power-play goal and added an assist in Friday's 4-1 win in Winona and then added an assist in the 3-0 win in St. Peter on Saturday. In addition to her offensive contribution, Randall anchored a defense that allowed only one goal and limited the Cardinals to just 20 shots on goal in the two games. Randall has been the catalyst for a Gustavus defensive effort that has allowed opponents only two goals in the past eight conference games. The Gusties are currently 14-5-0 overall and 10-2-0 in the MIAC.

February 2, 2004

Concordia College junior forward **Lindsay Czarnecki** (Riverside, Calif./Riverside Poly HS) scored four goals and collected one assist in Concordia's weekend sweep at Saint Benedict. The two victories snapped a four-game losing streak and jumped the Cobbers into a tie for sixth place in the MIAC. On Friday night, Czarnecki scored both of her goals in the second period to help Concordia to a 5-3 victory. She scored the team's second goal of the game to tie the score at 2-2, midway through the period. She then added her second goal later in the period after the Blazers had jumped ahead 3-2. She also added an assist on the final goal of the game. In the series finale, Czarnecki scored two more goals to help the Cobbers come from behind to beat CSB 8-5.

January 26, 2004

Saint Mary's University senior forward **Emily Kearns** (Hopkins, Minn.) scored three goals and added a pair of assists in the Cardinals' 5-2 win over Augsburg on Friday. The SMU senior, who leads the team in all three offensive categories with 14 goals, 13 assists and 27 points, not only recorded her first hat trick of the season, but also assisted on SMU's two other goals in the game. Kearns had her point-scoring streak snapped at nine in the Cardinals' 2-1 loss to the Auggies on Saturday in the second game of the two-game series.

January 19, 2004

St. Olaf College sophomore defender **Lindsay Weier** (Menomonie, Wis.) scored two goals and added an assist in the Oles 5-1 victory over Augsburg Friday evening. In conference play, Weier has tallied 4 goals and 4 assists and is second in the MIAC in defense scoring. The Oles picked up two key victories this weekend moving them into a second place tie in the conference.

January 12, 2004

University of St. Thomas first-year forward **Allison Turgeon** (Bloomington, Minn./Jefferson) scored three goals and one assist to help the Tommies claim a pair of one-goal wins over previous MIAC co-leader St. Olaf. Turgeon came into the weekend with no goals and one assist on her short college career but broke out with two goals to help the Toms take a 4-1 lead in Saturday's 4-3 road win. She came back with an assist and a goal to help the Toms take a 3-1 lead in Sunday's 3-2 home victory. St. Thomas is 6-0 in the MIAC and 8-3-1 overall coming into a key weekend series with Saint Mary's.

Augsburg first-year forward **Kristin Murr** (Thornton, Colo./Quest Academy HS) tied a school record with two goals in a 16-second span, contributing three goals and an assist on the weekend as Augsburg swept two games, a 3-0 win over Bethel on Friday and a 7-4 win over UW-River Falls on Saturday. Murr scored a goal in the victory over Bethel and had two goals and an assist in the win over UW-River Falls, as Augsburg rallied from a 3-2 deficit to claim the win. Her goals in a 16-second span tied the school record for quickest two goals and clinched the victory early in the third period. Murr now has eight goals on the season, second-best on the team.

December 8, 2003

Gustavus Adolphus College fresh-year goaltender **Kara Meyer** (Detroit Lakes, Minn.) turned away 37 of 40 shots to help Gustavus claim a weekend sweep over Augsburg in MIAC play. Meyer made 18 saves and allowed one goal as Gustavus beat the Auggies 3-1 on Friday night. On Saturday afternoon, Meyer recorded 19 saves and allowed two goals as the Gusties rallied to claim a 4-2 victory. Meyer, who picked up the first two wins of her collegiate career, posted a .925 save percentage and a 1.50 goals against average in the series. Gustavus is currently 4-3-0 overall and 2-2-0 in the MIAC.

December 1, 2003

College of St. Catherine first year forward **Angie Johnson** (Wadena, Minn.) helped lead the Wildcats to a 4-4 tie on Tuesday night against UW-Eau Claire. Johnson scored once in each period to earn the hat trick and secure the tie for St. Kate's. Johnson is currently the team's leading goal scorer.

November 24, 2003

Augsburg College senior forward **Annie Annunziato** (Commack, N.Y.) dominated the action in Augsburg's two-game sweep of Hamline, winning 12-1 (a single-game team goal record) on Thursday and 5-0 on Friday. In the 12-1 win, Annunziato set single-game school records with five goals and eight total points (adding three assists). In Friday's win, Annunziato had two goals, giving her a 10-point weekend (seven goals, three assists). Annunziato is currently eighth nationally in total scoring this season (2.20 points per game, seven goals, four assists, 11 points).
