# 2004-05 MIAC Women's Hockey Athlete of the Week

#### March 7, 2005

Gustavus Adolphus College sophomore defender **Andrea Peterson** (Vadnais Heights, Minn./White Bear Lake HS) scored three goals and picked up two assists for five points as Gustavus defeated St. Mary's 5-1 and St. Thomas 3-2 in double overtime to win the MIAC Playoff Championship. Peterson scored two goals and added two assists in the Gusties 5-1 semifinal win over Saint Mary's on Thursday and then added one goal in the Gusties win over St. Thomas on Saturday. Peterson's goal, which came on the power play, tied the game at 2-2 at 7:17 of the third period. Peterson, who was named MIAC Player of the Year last week, has now tallied 28 goals and 28 assists for 56 points this season. She ranks second in Div. III in points scored and needs two points to tie the Gustavus record for points in a season which is 58. The Gusties (23-3-2) will play the UW-Stevens Point this weekend in the quarterfinal round of the NCAA Tournament in Stevens Point, Wis.

# February 28, 2005

University of St. Thomas sophomore goaltender **Katie Jetland** (Excelsior, Minn./Benilde-St. Margaret HS) stopped 21 of 22 shots Saturday, including several on sprawling saves, to help the Tommies halt the high-scoring Gustavus' 33-game winning streak vs. MIAC foes with a 2-1 victory. The Gusties were averaging 6.6 gpg and have the top four scorers in the MIAC. Jetland finished the conference season 9-0 with 1.00 GAA and a .942 save percentage. She also helped UST post a school-record 20 wins. The No. 8-ranked Toms will host St. Olaf in the MIAC playoff semifinals Thursday (5 p.m.) in Mendota Heights.

# February 21, 2005

Gustavus Adolphus College sophomore defender **Andrea Peterson** (Vadnais Heights, Minn. / White Bear Lake HS) scored five goals and contributed two assists for seven points as the Gusties swept the College of Saint Benedict 6-1 and 11-0. Peterson scored three goals in Friday's 6-1 win in St. Cloud and then added two goals and two assists in Saturday's 11-0 win in St. Peter. Peterson, who ranks second in Division III in points per game at 2.22, increased her season point total to 51 with 25 goals and 26 assists. She becomes only the fifth player in Gustavus women's hockey history to score 50 points in a season. The Gusties are currently 20-2-1 overall and 16-0-0 in the MIAC. The team is in the midst of a 32-game winning streak against MIAC opponents. Coach Mike Carroll's squad, which is currently in first place in the conference, will play second place St. Thomas for the regular season MIAC championship this weekend.

## February 14, 2005

College of Saint Benedict senior left wing **Susan Engel** (Roseville, Minn) led the offensive attack for the Blazers in their weekend sweep of Hamline. On Friday night, Engel recorded a goal and two assists, with her goal being the game-winner. Saturday night, Engel followed up with a two-goal, one-assist performance, with her first goal (the Blazers' third) again being the game-winner. For the weekend, Susan finished with three goals - two game-winning goals - and three assists for a total of six points.

# February 7, 2005

St. Olaf College freshman forward **Lindsey Boeser** (Burnsville, Minn./Lakeville HS) had two assists and a goal in a 4-1 and 3-2 sweep of Augsburg this weekend. Boeser assisted on the game-winner 5:30 into the second period in Friday's 4-1 win and on Susannah Brokl's goal in the third period. In Saturday's win, Boeser scored the game-winning shorthanded goal with 4:01 to play in the third period. With the sweep, the Oles moved three points past the Auggies into third place in the MIAC. Boeser's 22 points and 12 assists lead St. Olaf and her 10 goals are one shy of the team lead. The Oles, winners of four straight, play host to UW-River Falls Tuesday.

## January 31, 2005

Saint Mary's University sophomore goaltender **Nikki Jung** (Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) stopped all 31 shots she faced Saturday afternoon, as Saint Mary's snapped a two-game losing streak with a 3-0 victory over UW-Eau Claire. Jung, who stopped all 30 shots she faced in a period and a half of relief in the teams' first meeting on Jan. 7, has now kicked out 61 straight shots vs. the Blugolds this season. The sophomore, who has started 13 of the Cardinals' 17 games this season, boasts a 2.71 goals-against-average and a .920 save percentage.

## January 24, 2005

Augsburg College junior forward **Jocelyn Cookson** (Edina, Minn./Bloomington Jefferson HS) had a four-goal weekend, including three goals on special team situations, as Augsburg swept St. Benedict to stay in contention for a conference playoff berth. Cookson scored both Auggie goals in Friday's 2-1 win, one on the power play in the first period and the second on a stuff from the side of the net in the second period. In Saturday's 4-2 win in St. Cloud, Cookson brought the Auggies back from an early 2-0 deficit with a shorthanded, unassisted goal in the second period and a power-play goal in the third. Cookson now has a team-high 14 goals and 23 points, second-best on the team. In MIAC play, Cookson now has 10 goals, second-most among league players. Nationally, Cookson now is ranked No. 9 in goals-per-game (0.88) and No. 21 in points-per-game (1.44).

# January 17, 2005

University of St. Thomas freshman forward **Ashley Reinhardt** (Eagan, Minn.) had three goals Friday and a goal and two assists Saturday to lead the No. 8-ranked Tommies to a pair of 6-0 victories over Concordia-Moorhead. Friday's game was scoreless through one period but Reinhardt scored twice in the first 5:10 of period two for a 3-0 lead. Reinhardt now has eight goals and six assists on the season. The Tommies have allowed eight goals in their last 12 games and improved to 10-2-1 overall and 7-0-1 in the MIAC.

## January 10, 2005

Gustavus Adolphus College first-year forward Molly Doyle (Eagan, Minn.) scored four goals and recorded two assists for six points to help the Gusties post

a record of 2-1 against three nationally rated teams in River Falls, Wis. last weekend. Doyle scored a key third period goal in the Gusties heartbreaking 4-3 overtime loss to #1 Middlebury on Friday. She added two goals and two assists as Gustavus beat #10 Williams 6-1 on Saturday. One of her two goals was a shorthanded goal that gave the Gusties a 3-0 lead in the second period. Doyle finished off her impressive weekend with one goal in the Gusties 6-4 win over #3 Wis.-Stevens Point. Her goal tied the game at 1-1 in the first period. Doyle leads Gustavus in scoring with eight goals and 12 assists for 20 points. She also ranks 10th in Division III with an average 1.82 points per game. The Gusties are currently 9-1-1 overall and 6-0-0 in the MIAC.

#### December 13, 2004

Augsburg College junior forward **Jocelyn Cookson** (Edina, Minn./Bloomington Jefferson HS) had four goals and one assist for five points on the weekend, as Augsburg swept St. Catherine 4-1 and 4-2 in MIAC play. In Friday's 4-1 home victory, Cookson claimed a natural hat trick with three consecutive goals, one in the first period and two in the second period, as Augsburg built a 3-0 lead en route to the victory. It was Cookson's first collegiate hat trick. In Saturday's 4-2 win at St. Catherine, Cookson had a goal and an assist. Cookson, a transfer from Division I Wisconsin, currently stands third on the team in scoring (18 points, with 10 goals) and eight assists. Cookson is one of three Auggies to be ranked in the top 20 nationally in points-per-game (she ranks 19th), and currently ranks 16th nationally in goals-per-game.

# December 6, 2004

Hamline University senior forward **Emily Gross** (West St. Paul, Minn./Sibley) led the Pipers to a series split against Bethel. Gross tied a school record with four goals and totaled five points in Hamline's 6-2 win over the Royals on Saturday night. Gross tallied a pair of power-play goals on the evening. She gave Hamline a 1-0 lead with a power-play goal at 4:22 of the first period. Gross added a pair of goals in the second period and another power-play goal in the third. It was the first conference win for the Pipers since they beat Bethel on Feb. 16, 2002.

### November 29, 2004

Concordia-Moorhead freshman forward **Ashley Anderson** (Fargo, N.D./Fargo South HS) scored two of Concordia's three goals in a weekend split with Lake Forest. In a 2-1 win on Friday, Nov. 26, Anderson scored the game-winning goal with 11:11 left in the game as the Cobbers rebounded from a 1-0 third period deficit to earn their first win of the season. In Saturday's 2-1 loss, Anderson scored Concordia's only goal of the game on the power play in the second period to give Concordia a 1-0 lead. Anderson currently leads the Cobbers with three goals in six games this season.

#### November 22, 2004

Gustavus Adolphus College sophomore defender **Andrea Peterson** (Vadnais Heights, Minn.) recorded three goals and three assists in two wins over Hamline this past weekend. Peterson tallied two goals and an assist on Friday night to help defeat the Pipers 7-0 in St. Paul, Minn. The sophomore scored one goal and assisted on two others on Saturday night to defeat the Pipers 8-0 in St. Peter, Minn. Peterson has four goals and five assists to lead the team in points with nine. The Gusties improved to 3-0-1 overall and are currently ranked sixth in the most recent USCHO.com Division III Women's Poll.

# November 15, 2004

Augsburg sophomore forward **Stacy Anderson** (Lafayette, Calif./Marina HS) has had a strong start to the 2004-05 season, with seven goals and six assists for 13 points in the Auggies' 2-0-2 start, with two ties against Lake Forest (III.) last weekend and two wins over Finlandia (Mich.) this past weekend. Anderson claimed her first collegiate hat trick with a three-goal, one-assist performance in Friday's 7-0 win over Finlandia, and had two goals and two assists in the Auggies' 6-3 win over Finlandia on Saturday. Her first five goals of the season all came on the power play -- giving her a total that currently stands as the most power-play goals in the nation among Division III players. She currently stands fourth nationally in points per game (3.25) and is tied with three other players for the most goals (seven) in Division III hockey.
