Gustavus Adolphus College senior forward **Molly Doyle** (Richfield, Minn.) scored the game-winning goal at 17:14 in the third period to give Gustavus a 1-0 victory over St. Thomas in the MIAC Playoff Championship game on Wednesday night in St. Peter. Doyle recorded her third power play goal of the season as the Gusties won the post-season title game for the fifth consecutive season over St. Thomas and clinched a berth in the NCAA Women's Hockey Tournament. Doyle, who ranks fifth on the all-time Gustavus scoring list with 131 points (68g, 63a), has compiled two goals and three assists in eight MIAC post-season games, including an assist on the game-winning goal in the 2007 title game.

Sandra Felten, Bethel

Bethel University junior forward **Sandra Felten** (Cashton, Wis.) scored the game-tying goal in the third period of Bethel's 1-1 tie against St. Catherine on Thursday, then scored the game-winning goal the following night in the Royals' 4-2 win over the Wildcats to secure Bethel's second trip to the MIAC playoffs in three years. Felten finished the regular season having scored goals in each of her last nine games - all against conference opponents - making her the leading conference goal scorer with 19 overall and 16 in MIAC play. She is also second in the nation with seven game-winning goals thanks to Friday's performance.

Lauren Bradel, St. Thomas

University of St. Thomas sophomore goaltender **Lauren Bradel** (Bemidji, Minn.) stopped 41 of 42 shots to lead the Tommies to a 4-1, 5-0 weekend sweep of Saint Mary's that secured UST's eighth consecutive MIAC playoff trip. She now has six shutouts on the season. Bradel and her teammates killed off all 12 power-play tries on the weekend, and Bradel has a streak of 52 consecutive power-play kills over her last 12 games. Bradel is now 14-4 on the season and ranks in the top eight nationally in both save percentage (.950) and GAA (1.17).

Sandra Felten, Bethel

Bethel University junior forward **Sandra Felten** (Cashton, Wis.) earned five points on three goals and two assists in Bethel's weekend sweep of Saint Mary's. In Friday night's game, Felten scored the first and third goals of Bethel's 3-0 shutout of the Cardinals. The following night, Felten assisted on two power-play goals and scored Bethel's first shorthanded goal of the season. The goal ultimately proved to be the game winner, bringing her season total to six game-winning goals, which leads the conference. Felten now has 15 goals overall on the season, making her the leader in both overall and conference goals scored with 12.

Alyssa Dahl, Concordia

Concordia College junior forward Alyssa Dahl (Willmar, Minn.) scored a hat trick on Friday and had two assists on Saturday in the Cobbers' weekend sweep over Augsburg. All told she had a hand in five of the six Concordia goals scored in the two-game sweep. With the two wins Concordia, who was predicted to finish sixth in the MIAC Coaches' Preseason Poll, remains in sole possession of third place in the league standings. The Cobbers currently have eight wins in the MIAC which tied the most since the 2002-03 season. On Friday, Dahl scored all three goals in a 3-0 win over the Auggies. She scored the first of her three scores only five seconds apart - that is an MIAC record for fastest back-to-back goals by a single player and is believed to also be a national record. She added the third goal less than four minutes later in the third period after CC was tied 0-0 heading into the final period. Her three goals in a span of 3:56 is the fastest hat trick by a single player in school history and could be a conference record as well. On Saturday, Dahl had a pair of assists and helped CC claim a 3-2 win. All told in the two games Dahl had 14 shots.

Stefanie Ubl, Gustavus

Gustavus Adolphus College senior forward **Stefanie Ubl** (Blaine, Minn.) recorded five points (three goals and two assists) as the Gusties remained undefeated in MIAC play with 5-1 and 6-0 wins over Augsburg. Ubl posted a goal and two assists in Gustavus' 5-1 win on Friday night in Minneapolis. On Saturday, Ubl scored two goals including a power-play goal in a 6-0 win in St. Peter. Ubl is the team's leading scorer and the top scorer in the MIAC with 20 points (9g, 11a).
