Gustavus Adolphus College junior defender **Kirstin Peterson** (St. Paul, Minn./Hill-Murray) scored four points including two goals and two assists to help the Gusties win their seventh consecutive MIAC Playoff Title with wins over St. Olaf (5-0) and St. Catherine (5-1) last week. In Thursday's semifinal win over St. Olaf, Peterson assisted on the Gusties first goal, which turned out to be the gamewinner, and then scored the team's fourth goal in the second period and fifth goal in the third period. She was also a key part of the defensive effort that helped Gustavus post its fourth consecutive shutout. In Saturday's championship game, Peterson was a part of a defensive effort that limited the Wildcats to just 19 shots and one goal and she picked up her fourth point of the weekend with an assist on Alyssa Gaulrapp's goal in the third period. Peterson, who led the MIAC scoring by defensemen with three goals and 13 assists for 16 points, currently ranks fifth in Division III in the same category with six goals and 18 assists for 24 points. Gustavus, which is currently 21-4-2, will host UW-River Falls on Saturday, March 13 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

## Lauren Bradel, St. Thomas

University of St. Thomas senior goaltender **Lauren Bradel** (Bemidji, Minn.) stopped 75 of 77 shots and won her MIAC-best 48th and 49th career games as the Tommies topped Concordia-Moorhead 6-1 on Friday and in overtime 2-1 on Saturday. The 49 wins ties for eighth best in D-III women's history. She helped kill off 13 of 14 Cobber power-play chances. The Cobbers came into the weekend averaging nearly four goals a game. She's 3-1-1 this season against the other four MIAC playoff teams, with the defeat a 1-0 decision to St. Olaf. On her career, Bradel is 49-20-5 with 17 shutouts, a .934 save percentage and 1.63 GAA.

#### Katelyn Dold, Concordia


St. Cloud, Minn. / Tech Week of: 2010-02-22



Concordia College sophomore forward **Katelyn Dold** (St. Cloud, Minn./Tech) had two goals and two assists in the Cobbers' series sweep over Hamline on Friday and Saturday. The two must-win games for Concordia keeps them in the hunt for the MIAC playoffs. The Cobbers are now 7-7-2 in conference play and tied for sixth place in the league standings - only one point out of the fifth, and final, playoff spot. Dold started the scoring in Concordia's 4-1 win in the first game. Her goal kick-started the Cobber offense and helped CC score three times in the first period - a period that would set the tone for the entire series. Dold then added a goal and two assists in Concordia's 8-0 victory on Saturday. Dold has now recorded at least one point in 10 of the team's last 12 games and currently leads the MIAC in scoring. Dold has 12 goals and 16 assists for 28 points in conference play and is leading the league in scoring by eight points. She is also first in goals scored and assists in the MIAC.

The weekend sweep of the Pipers helped the Gusties move into a first place tie with St. Thomas and St. Kate's in the MIAC standings. In the series against Hamline, Mackley registered two goals and two assists in Friday's 5-1 win in St. Paul and then added one goal and one assist in Saturday's 3-1 win in St. Peter. Trailing 1-0 on Friday, Mackley scored two goals in the second period (her second was the gamewinner) and then assisted on the third and fourth goals in the third period. On Saturday, Mackley scored the first goal to give Gustavus a 1-0 lead in the first period and then assisted on the gamewinner in the second period. With her seven points on the week, Mackley moved into ninth place on the career scoring list at Gustavus with 30 goals and 65 assists for 95 points.

The following afternoon, Newstrom allowed just one goal in regulation, which forced overtime as the two teams were tied at 1-1. Newstrom has the second highest save percentage in the conference.

## Kara Ledel, St. Thomas

University of St. Thomas senior forward **Kara Ledel** (Shakopee, Minn.) scored both Tommie goals in Friday's 2-1 road victory over No. 5-ranked Gustavus that snapped the Gusties' 50-game MIAC unbeaten streak (48-0-2). She had the tying goal on a power play midway through period two, then scored the game winner with 4:35 left in regulation. Ledel also skated well but didn't score in Saturday's 2-2 tie on UST's home ice. It marked the first time in 55 weekend conference series that the Gusties were denied a victory. It also was the first time in 66 games that any player scored twice in a game on Gustavus' stingy defense. In six previous games played on Gustavus' home ice, Ledel and fellow UST seniors had won just one of six games (1-0, on a short-handed goal) and the Toms scored just three total goals in those six. Ledel has 27 goals and 21 assists in 83 career games.

### Allie Schwab, Gustavus

Gustavus Adolphus College sophomore forward **Allie Schwab** (Stillwater, Minn.) picked up four points (two goals and two assists) as the Gusties dropped a non-conference game at UW-Superior 3-2, and swept Bethel by the scores of 7-0 and 2-1 last week. Schwab recorded an assist against UW-Superior, and then scored two goals and registered another assist in the Bethel series. On Friday, Schwab scored a goal and added and assist in the Gusties 7-0 win in Blaine, and then on Saturday, she scored the gamewinner at 17:55 of the second period as Gustavus slipped past the Royals 2-1 in St. Peter. Schwab currently ranks second in scoring for the Gusties with four goal and two assists for six points in four games.
