2001-02 MIAC Women's Swimming & Diving Athletes of the Week

February 4, 2002

Macalester College sophomore **Liz Fitzgerald** (Plymouth, Mich./Plymouth-Canton HS) won both 1 and 3 meter diving events this past weekend in a meet versus St. Thomas. Fitzgerald scored 329.30 points on 1 meter and 389.70 points on 3 meter narrowly missing the NCAA qualifying standard. Her accomplishments are more remarkable by the fact that she did not start diving until she entered college a year and a half ago.

January 28, 2002

Macaleser College junior **Janna Lundquist** (Minneapolis, Minn./Minneapolis South) established herself as one of the top backstrokers in the MIAC over the weekend. On Firday, Lundquist pulled out a 1:10.84 for the 100 meter Backstroke breaking the Scots school record and winning the event. Lundquist came back on Saturday to lower that record to 1:10.76 and also set a school record in the 200 meter backstroke with a winning time of 2:34.62.

January 22, 2002

Carleton College senior **Angie Soucek** (Colorado Springs, Colo.) had an impressive weekend of diving establishing two NCAA qualifying standards for 1 meter and 3 meter. Soucek's set a new team record in the one-meter diving event with a score of 261.95, obliterating the old record of 255.75.

January 14, 2002

St. Olaf College first-year **Katie Detwiler** (Atkinson, Wisc.) won five individual events and was a member of a winning relay leading her team to two wins over the weekend. Detwiler won the 200 IM (2:17.28), 500 freestyle (5:24.50) and was a member of the winning 200 medlay relay against Macalester on Friday and won the 1000 freestyle (11:01.23), 200 Im (2:17.14) and 200 backstroke (2:19.12) against UW Eau Claire on Saturday.

December 10, 2001

Gustavus Adolphus College first-year **Eva Miller** (Sartell, Minn.) had an outstanding weekend of swimming, winning four events at the Augustana Invitational in Rock Island, IL. Miller won the 100 Breaststroke (1:09.71) and 200 Breaststroke in a pool record time of 2:29.46. Both times are among the best in the conference and very close to NCAA "B" standards. She also swam the breaststroke leg on the winning 200 and 400 Medley relays.

December 3, 2001

Gustavus Adolphus College sophomore **Sarah Crane** (Mason City, Iowa) had a pair of impressive swims over the weekend in a meet vs UW-Stevens Point. Crane won both the 1,000 Freestyle in 11:11.35 and the 500 Freestyle in 5:29.0 to helped the Gusties win the meet. Crane is one of the top distance swimmers in the conference and has finished no lower than second place in all her individual events this year and leads the team in the 500 Free, 1000 Free and 400 IM.

November 19, 2001

Carleton College sophomore **Marie Marsman** (Mountain View, Cali.) was named Athlete of the Week for MIAC Swimming and Diving with very impressive performances at the Minnesota Invitational. Marsman swam the 50 Free and 100 Freestyle, achieving NCAA automatic qualifying standards in both events as well as MIAC Records. Her time in the 50 and 100 Free were 23.71 and 51.39 respectively. Marsman's 100 Free ranks her top in the nation for Division III.

November 12, 2001

Gustavus Adolphus College sophomore **Andrea Kleven** (Eden Prairie, Minn.) had an impressive weekend breaking three Gustavus pool records and achieving 2 NCAA 'B" cuts. Leading off the 400 Medley Relay, Kleven split a 1:00.6 in the backstroke, later swimming a 1:00.26 in the individual 100 Backstroke and achieving a NCAA "B" cut. Her 200 IM was swum in a pool record 2:12.29 and 200 Back in 2:12.20 was also a pool record and NCAA "B" cut. Kleven was the 2001 MIAC Champion in 100 and 200 Back and the 200 IM and advancing to the NCAA Divsion III Championships.

November 5, 2001

Carleton College sophomore **Marie Marsman** (Mountain View, CA) had an outstanding weekend of swimming with 4 NCAA "B" cuts in the 50 Free (24.21), 100 Free (52.55), 200 Free (1:54.85) and 100 Fly (1:00.23). Marsman was also a part of the 200 Free Relay that made a B standard with a time of 1:38.54. All the above were pool records in addition to Carleton's 400 Free Relay which went a 3:38.78.
