St. Olaf men, Gustavus women win MIAC 's

February 17, 2007

MINNEAPOLIS - The St. Olaf College men and the Gustavus Adolphus College women claimed MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships on Saturday night at the University of Minnesota Aquatics Center.

Gustavus all but wrapped up the team title when they went 1-2-3-4-6 in the 200 Fly. Erin Hickey and Yoshi Ludwig took the top two spots going 2:15.45 and 2:15.48.

The Gusties' Carrie Gunderson won the 1650 Freestyle in 17:44.55. She also captured Thursday's 500 Free title.

Gustavus also got a win from Christie O'Conner in the 200 Back.

St. Olaf finished second. First year Alyssa Germeroth collected her second diving win of the meet with a win on the 1-meter board.

Becky Alexander of Carleton won the 100 Free (52.82). Kate Alexander won the 200 Breast, added her win total to two after Thursday's first place swim in the 200 IM.

MIAC's, Day Two: Ole men take lead, Gustie women still on top

MINNEAPOLIS - The St. Olaf College men moved into first place and the Gustavus Adolphus College women remained on top after the second day of the 2007 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships at the University of Minnesota's Aquatic Center on Friday night.

First place Gustavus won the 200 Medley Relay in a meet record 2:47.84. The Gusties' Sarah Koepp won the 100 Breast.

Friday's finals started with St. Olaf first year diver Alyssa Germeroth capturing a win in the 3-meter competition. The Oles' also got a win from Julia Rood, who won the 100 Fly (57.84), and a comeback win in the 800 Free Relay (7:51.31).

Carleton first year Kate Alexander, who won the 200 IM on Thursday, won the 400 IM in meet and league record 4:36.63. Teammate Karin Brown won the 200 Free in a come-from-behind 1:55.52.

Day One: Gustie men, women take early lead at MIAC's

MINNEAPOLIS - The Gustavus Adolphus College men's and women's swimming and diving teams each lead after day one of the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Championships at the University of Minnesota Aquatics Center.

The Gustavus women, who won the 400 Medley Relay and finished second in the 200 Medley Relay, had a win from first year Carrie Gunderson in the 500 Freestyle to help the Gusties to a first day lead.

St. Olaf is 20 points off the winning pace in second place.

Carleton College is in third. The Knights' first year Kate Alexander won the 200 IM with a 2:09.12. Carleton also had a win from its 200 Freestyle Relay team, which won in a time of 1:38.82.

Hamline's Dana Ketcher won the 50 Freestyle with a time of 24.47.
