#### **2017 MIAC Women's Tennis Conference Preview**

BLOOMINGTON, Minn. – Things don't get much more competitive than the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) 2016 women's tennis season. Last year's campaign ended with a three-way tie for the conference championship between Carleton, Gustavus and St. Thomas, and a look ahead at the 2017 season reveals there could be just as much drama and excitement at the top this season.

A year ago, the Knights, Gusties and Tommies each went 9-1 in conference play, splitting their round-robin and each claiming a share of the MIAC championship. The trititle was fitting for all three teams and their outstanding 2016 campaigns. Gustavus went 22-8 and added the MIAC Playoff crown and an NCAA bid to its great season, while Carleton finished 15-5 and St. Thomas went 16-3 overall. All three programs appear poised to continue challenging one another for conference supremacy.

St. Olaf went 7-3 a year ago, defeating all other teams that didn't tie for first, and the Oles posted a 10-5 overall record while finishing fourth in the MIAC. Bethel had an outstanding 19-5 overall record, and went 6-4 in conference play to join the top five, and St. Catherine

was 10-9 overall and an even 5-5 in the conference to finish sixth and round out the sixth and final spot in the MIAC Playoffs.

Saint Mary's went 13-7 overall, but just 4-6 in the league and finished just on the outside looking in of the conference postseason tournament. Saint Benedict was a game back of the Cardinals at 3-7 (6-10 overall). Hamline went 7-12 overall and 2-8 in league play to finish ninth, Macalester (4-13, 1-9 MIAC) was 10th and Concordia (0-16, 0-10 MIAC) rounded out the 2016 standings.

After 2016's parity, the 2017 season opens with plenty of big questions. Will one of last season's tri-champions separate themselves from the pack, or will it be another photo finish atop the standings? Are there any other teams ready to take that next step into the title race as well? Which teams will contend for the six Playoff bids, and who will rise to the occasion in the postseason to earn the MIAC's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament? Fortunately, the season is already under way, and the answers will materialize over and exciting three months.

#### **COACHES CAST THEIR VOTES**

After the too-close-to-call finish in 2016, the MIAC coaches expect it to be tight at the top again in 2017. In fact, they expect it to be so tight there was a tie for first place in the 2017 MIAC Women's Tennis Preseason Coaches' Poll. Both Carleton and Gustavus received 93 points to sit together atop the poll, with Carleton getting five first-place votes and Gustavus receiving four.

The Knights hope to stay at the top of the standings behind two-time All-MIAC selection Danielle Vasiliev, who was 12-3 at No. 1 singles a year ago, and the team has high hopes for first-year contributors Iman Quereshi and Zoe Park. The Gusties are again led by star senior Michaela Schulz and fellow All-MIAC picks Ally Baker and Briana Hartmann.

St. Thomas also got plenty of love from the coaches after last season's co-championship also, as the Tommies got the other two first-place votes and a total of 84 points to finish third in the poll. UST has a ton of experience back, with All-MIAC senior Paige Becher and two-time All-Conference juniors Caitlin Bakke and Jenna Zimmerman.

Bethel and St. Olaf were separated by just two points in the preseason poll, with the Royals and their 66 points coming in fourth, and the Oles finishing fifth with 64 points. Bethel has a pair of All-MIAC singles players back in Mattie Kidder and Sydney Parkinson, and Jill Weintzettel also returns for the Royals. The Oles have a pair of talented juniors back in their lineup, with All-MIAC singles and doubles selection Margaret Zimmerman and classmate Erin McDonald both returning.

St. Catherine is expected to join the six-team Playoff field with 56 points to finish sixth in the poll. The Wildcats will be led by All-MIAC senior Alicia Knoll and junior Julia Sporer. Saint Benedict and Saint Mary's both tied for seventh with 42 points each in the poll and hope to be in the Playoff mix as well. The Blazers bring back All-MIAC senior Laura Finn and talented junior Taylor Kraemer for first-year Head Coach Michael Engdahl, and the Cardinals will be led by seniors Haley Jorgensen and Megan Vandenberg, and have high hopes for the continued emergence of All-MIAC sophomore Laura Sonday.

Macalester (29 points) edged Hamline (24 points) by five points for ninth in the poll, and Concordia (13 points) grabbed the final spot in the

coaches' rankings. The Scots welcome back junior Lily Stein and a pair of sophomores – Della Brown and Jessica IIc – to lead the way in 2017. Hamline has a senior-laden lineup for first-year coach Julia Courter, with Jordan Danielson, Lilli Dennison and Emily Wollmuth all back in the Pipers' lineup. First-year Cobber Head Coach Joseph Murrey has top singles winner Kendra Stoick back, and a promising sophomore duo in Lisa Neumann and Breann Adamek.

#### 2017 MIAC Women's Tennis Playoffs

The 2017 MIAC Tennis Playoffs will mark the third-straight season of the new tournament format, which has top seeds hosting each round over the course of the five-day Playoffs. The field will include the top six teams in the conference standings, squaring off in a single-elimination tournament. Teams seeded No. 3 through No. 6 will square off on May 3 in the quarterfinals, with the winners meeting the top two seeds in the semifinals on May 5. The championship match will be held May 7 on the home court of the top remaining seed. The winner will receive the MIAC's automatic bid to the 2017 NCAA Division III Women's Tennis Tournament.
