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ST. PETER, MN. --- While the Gustavus Adolphus College tennis team was successfully defending its M.I.A.C. title last weekend, the Gustie track and golf teams each took fifth place in their respective conference meets. Earlier in the week the Gustie baseball team concluded its 1973 slate, finishing 6-10 and in eighth place in the final M.I.A.C. baseball standings.

The unexpected low finishes in baseball and golf, coupled with good showings by St. Thomas in baseball, golf and track, allowed the Tommies to claim the 1972-1973 M.I.A.C. All-Sports Title. The Tommies amassed $73\frac{1}{2}$ points in eleven sports to Gustavus' $70\frac{1}{2}$. St. John's also had $70\frac{1}{2}$ to tie the Gusties for second place.

Gustavus finished first in four sports, more than any other team in the conference. The Gusties copped championships in tennis, hockey, football and soccer. St. Thomas, although taking first in only one sport (basketball), exhibited a good balance throughout its sports program to win the title.
