6. NCAA Updates

A summary of the NCAA D3 National SAAC meeting from July 2022 was shared. Talia Williams (Carleton) term on National SAAC ends in January 2023. There will be an opportunity for a MIAC student-athlete to serve as an Associate Member on NCAA D3 SAAC, with nominations anticipated this winter. The NCAA provides opportunities for 40 diverse student-athletes to attend the NCAA Convention in January, via a nomination process through the NCAA. The NCAA recently adopted a new Constitution and also allows for student-athletes to benefit from their Name Image Likeness (NIL). The MIAC has provided each campus with a \$200 NCAA grant to assist with SAAC operations. There are several impactful proposals set for the 2023 NCAA Convention in January. In the next month, a communication will be sent to solicit the student-athlete voice regarding the proposals.

7. Special Olympics Partnership with NCAA DIII and MIAC

Resources were provided for the NCAA D3 initiative that partners Division III with Special Olympics. Campuses are encouraged to consider options opportunities to partner with Special Olympics which include: 1) Volunteering at SO events, 2) Campuses host a SO event, 3) Unified rivalries with other schools, 4) Polar Plunge (also have mobile polar plunge option for campuses), 5) SO is open to other events and ideas.
